

# A2J Author

Courts are challenged with the high cost of processing self-litigant filings because they are prone to errors, require lots of servicing and are usually paper based. These filers lack legal expertise, may have a language barrier, or are somewhat illiterate – and the court cannot provide legal assistance which can frustrate the public.

Since these filings are paper-based from PDF fillable forms, courts have to maintain adequate staff for walk-ins (including security) as well as all the costs associated with copying, routing, and delivering paper around and outside the court.

This leads to a lot of wasted time and resources for the court that could be used to improve a court's backlog.

These interfaces, called A2J Guided Interviews, take complex legal information from legal forms and present it in a straightforward way to the public.

A2J Guided Interviews remove many of the barriers faced by self-represented litigants, allowing them to easily complete and print court documents that are ready to be filed with the court system. Those robust features have led to proven results - 3 million A2J Guided Interviews run and 1.8 million documents assembled since 2005.
